## Marathon County Conservation Planning and Zoning—Dale Diamond



PRIVATE ONSITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM (POWTS) LOAN PROGRAM

We have exciting news to share. Marathon County, in collaboration with MCDEVCO, has developed a POWTS Loan program to provide

eligible property owners with a low interest loan to help offset a portion of the cost of replacing a failing POWTS. This loan will provide an avenue for financially challenged citizens to secure funding to upgrade their failing septic system.

"POWTS" stands for Private Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems, more commonly known as "septic systems".

Over the next 6 years, the Marathon County Conservation, Planning and Zoning Department (CPZ) will add approximately 6,000 POWTS (those installed before July 1, Department at: 1980) to the county's current POWTS maintenance program. This will require that property owners have their septic systems visually inspected by a licensed professional to determine the condition of the septic tank, to ensure that aboveground manhole openings are properly locked, and to check if pumping is needed or if sewage is discharging onto the ground surface. It is estimated that up to 1,250 of these septic systems may need to be repaired or replaced.

In the past, low income property owners replacing a failing POWTS were able to apply for financial assistance through the Wisconsin Fund Grant Program. Unfortunately, this state-funded grant program is ending December 30, 2019.

The Marathon County-MCDEVCO POWTS Loan has been created to ensure that financial assistance will be available to low-income residents for the replacement of failing POWTS. Certain small businesses, including farms, will also be eligible for a POWTS Loan under this program.

Eligibility for this loan is based upon criteria such as owner income, age of failing POWTS, category of failure, occupancy of the structure, etc. Details concerning eligibility and the loan application process are available from either the CPZ Department or MCDEVCO.

The original 1600 sq. foot Wausau animal hospital was first opened in 1967 by Dr. Norb Arnoldi. In 1996 it was purchased by Dr. Jeff Hinueber. Both former owners still live in the Wausau area and stop by to say hi.

In 2014 the practice was purchased by Jeff Gorr who was born in Sheboygan and Dr. Jaime Gifford Gorr who was born in Lake Geneva. Wausau Animal Hospital has always been locally owned and operated.

The brand new 4500 sq. foot facility was built by Scherrer Construction and financed through Peoples State Bank and MCDEVCO.

It features 4 dog only and 2 cat & small mammal exam rooms, a rehab & massage room, and a high definition digital x-ray machine.

We feature fully electronic medical records with free client access, our own app, and a rewards program.
